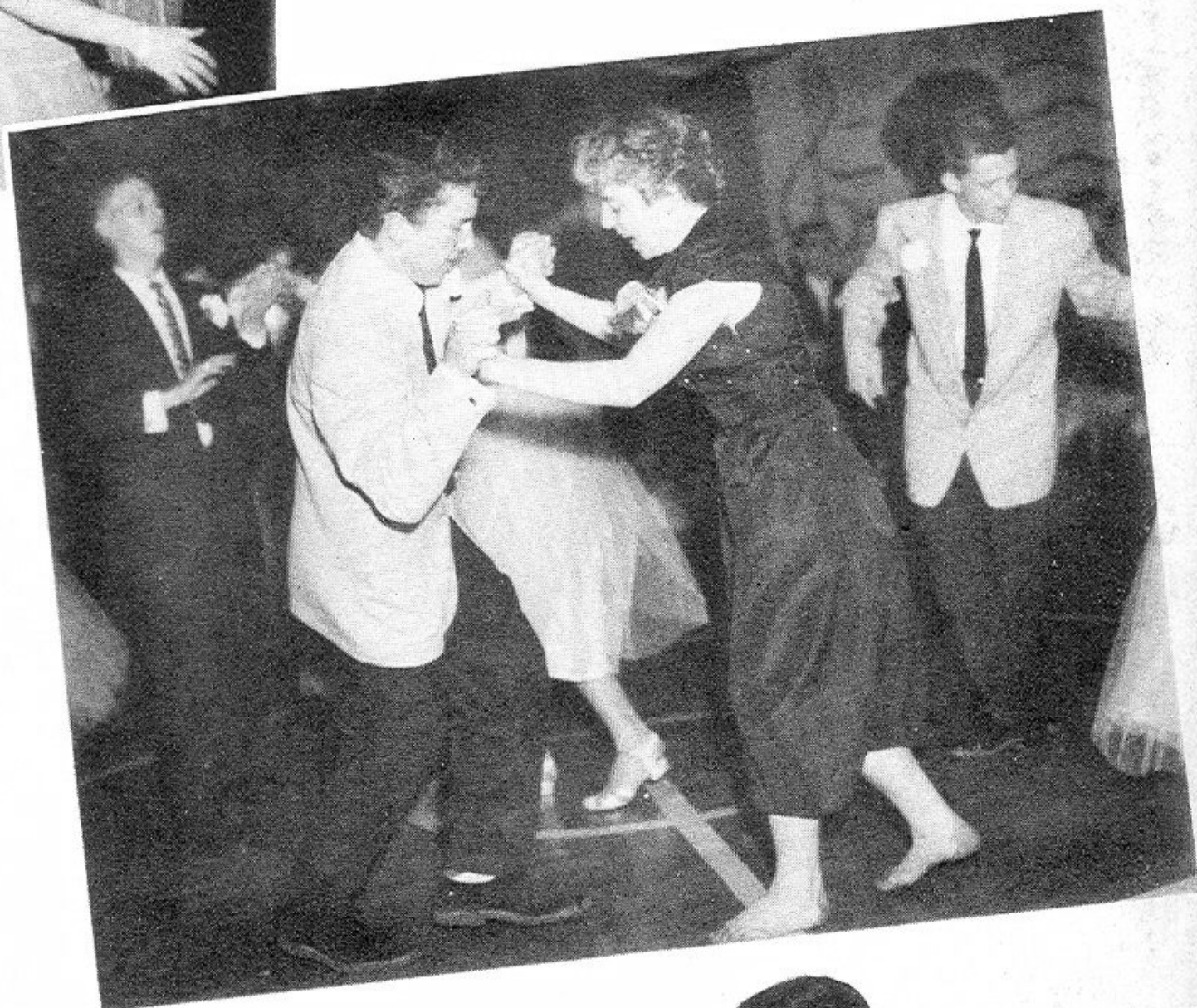

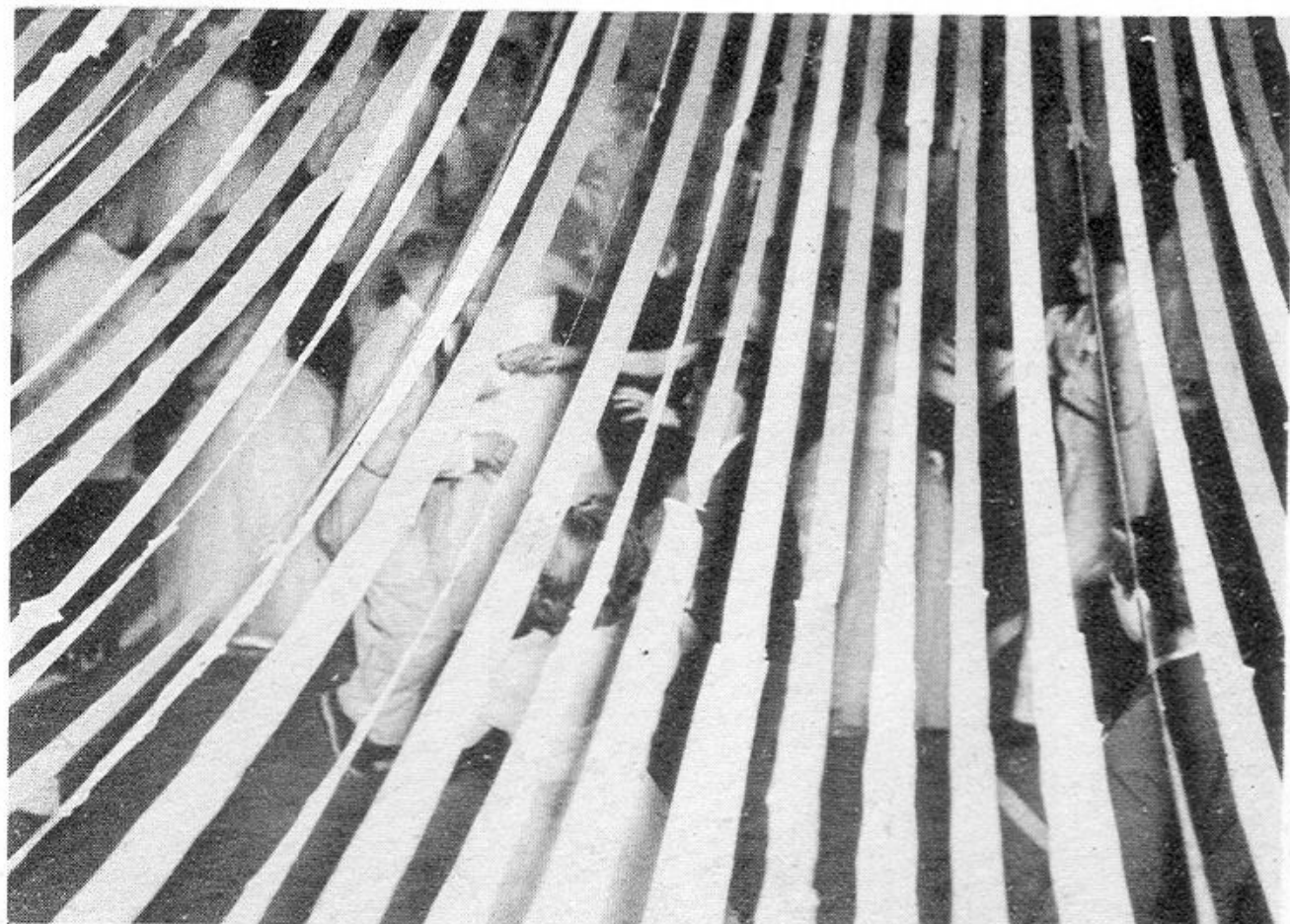
With all represented, we have loads of fun with our fellow class mates.

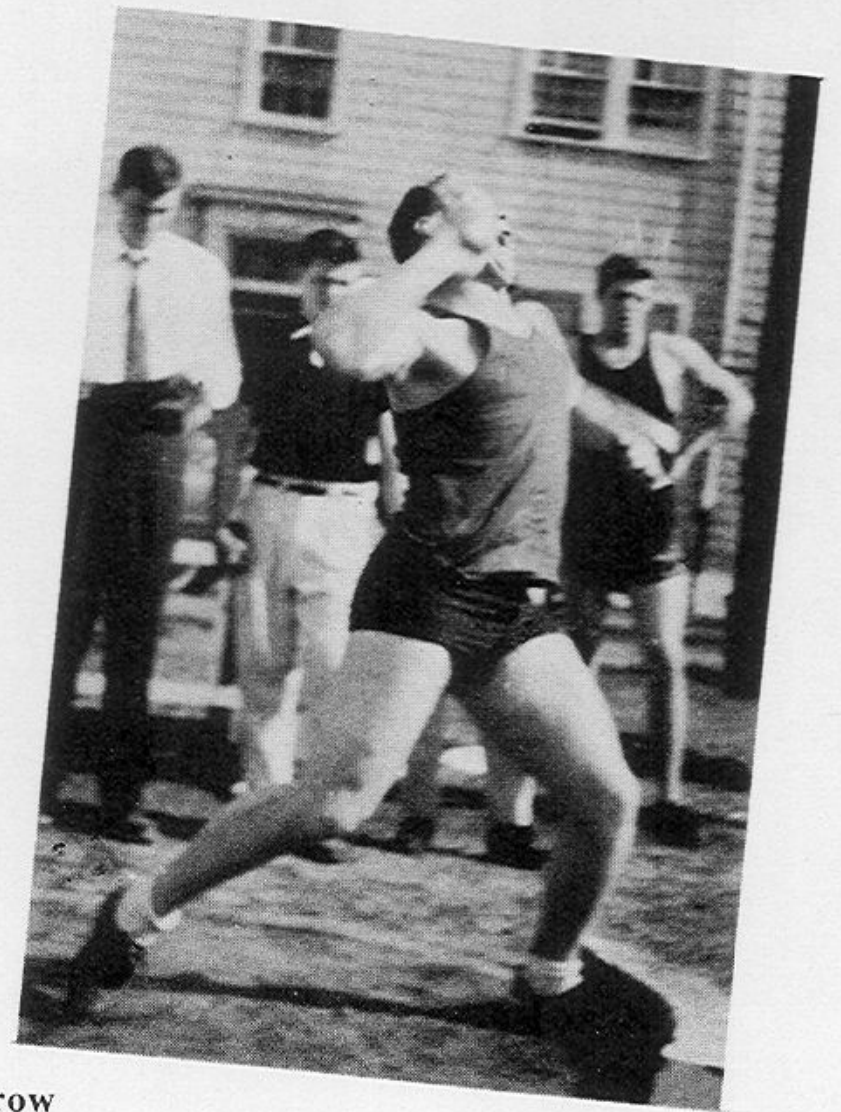




Baxter Berryhill at Chapel Hill, running the mile.

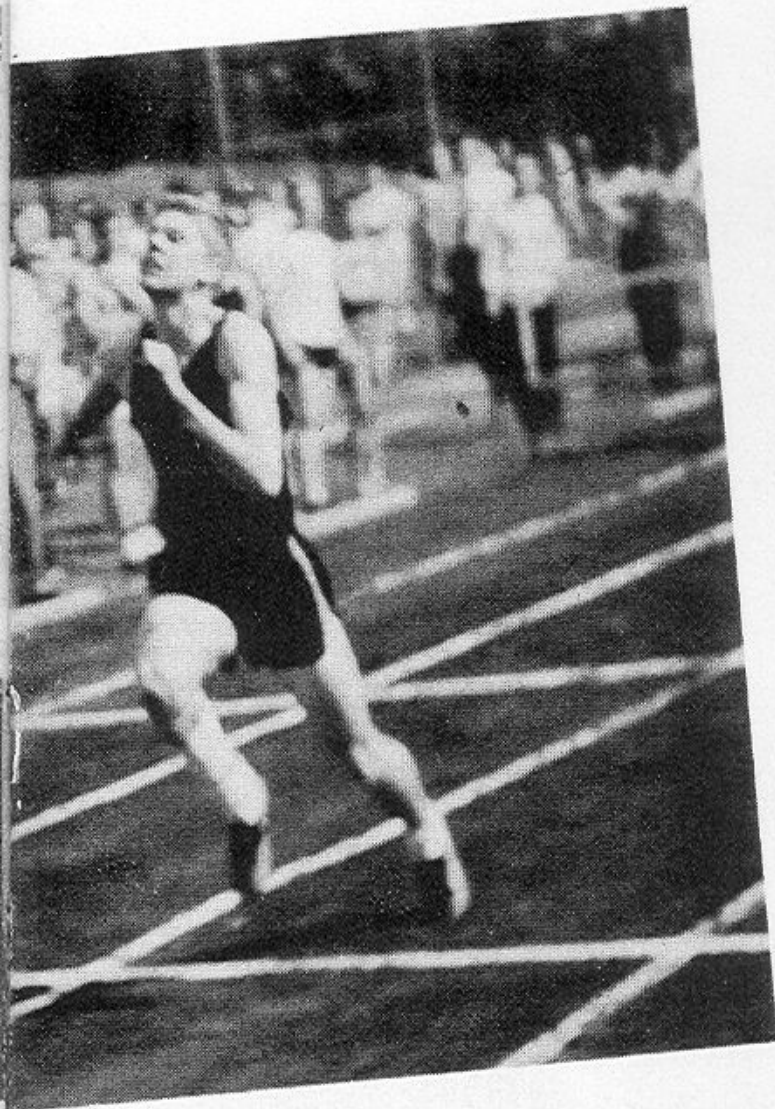

The team placed third in the Norport Division with a conference standing of four wins and four losses, for a percentage of .500.

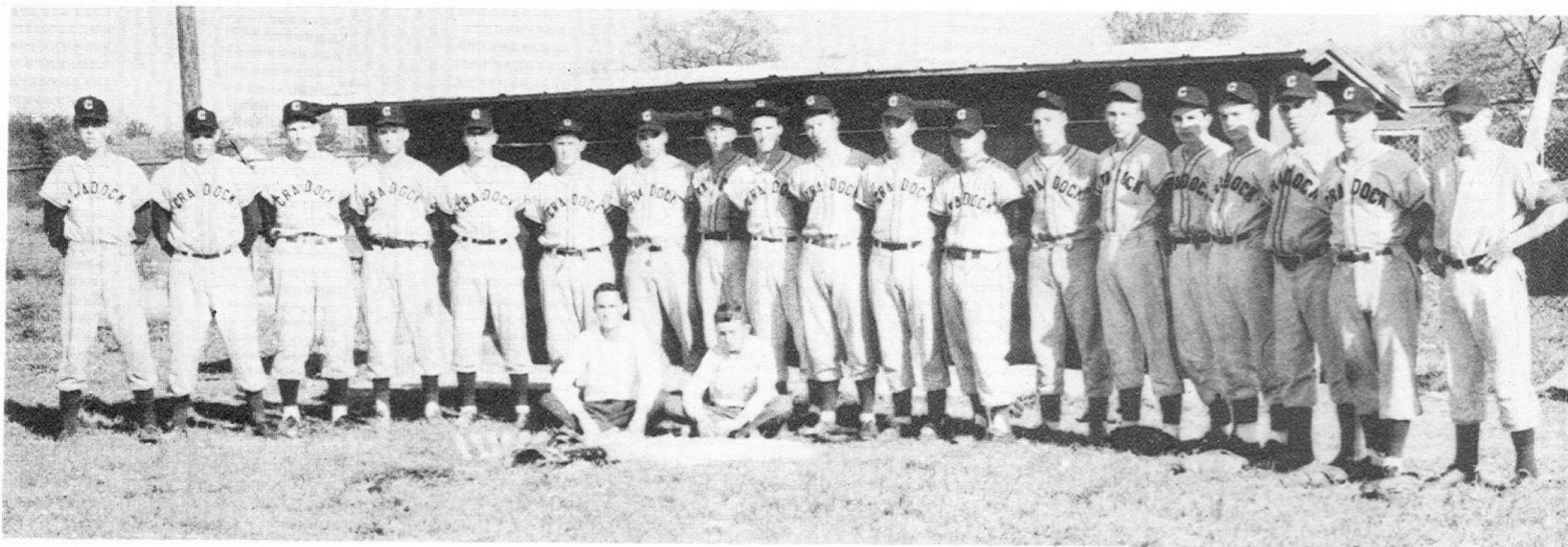

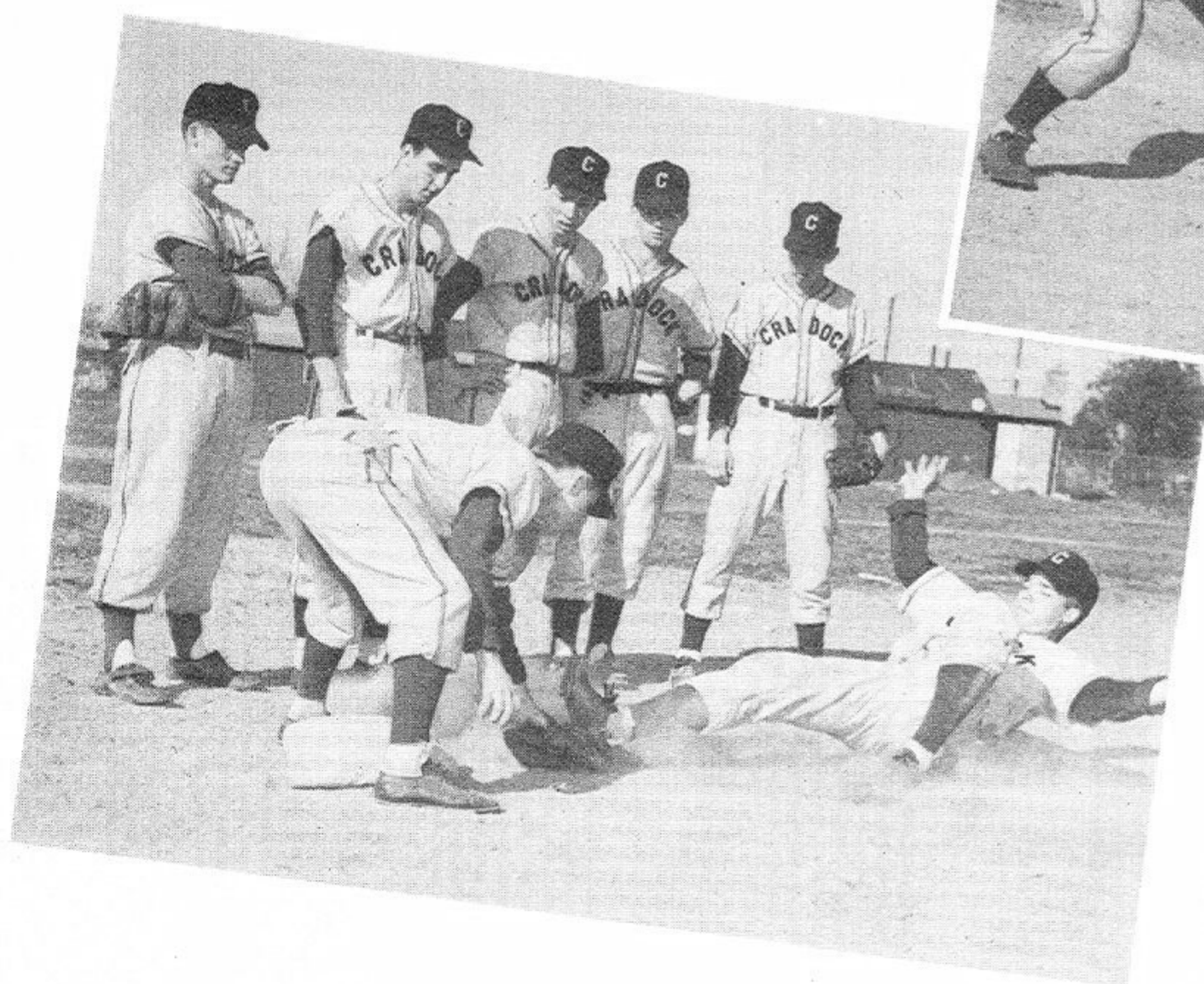

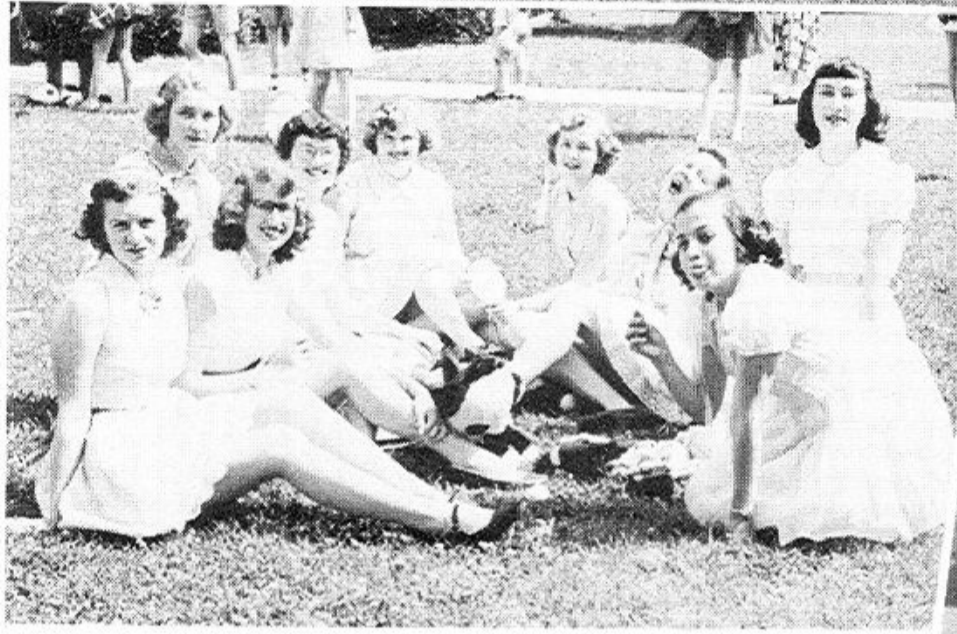

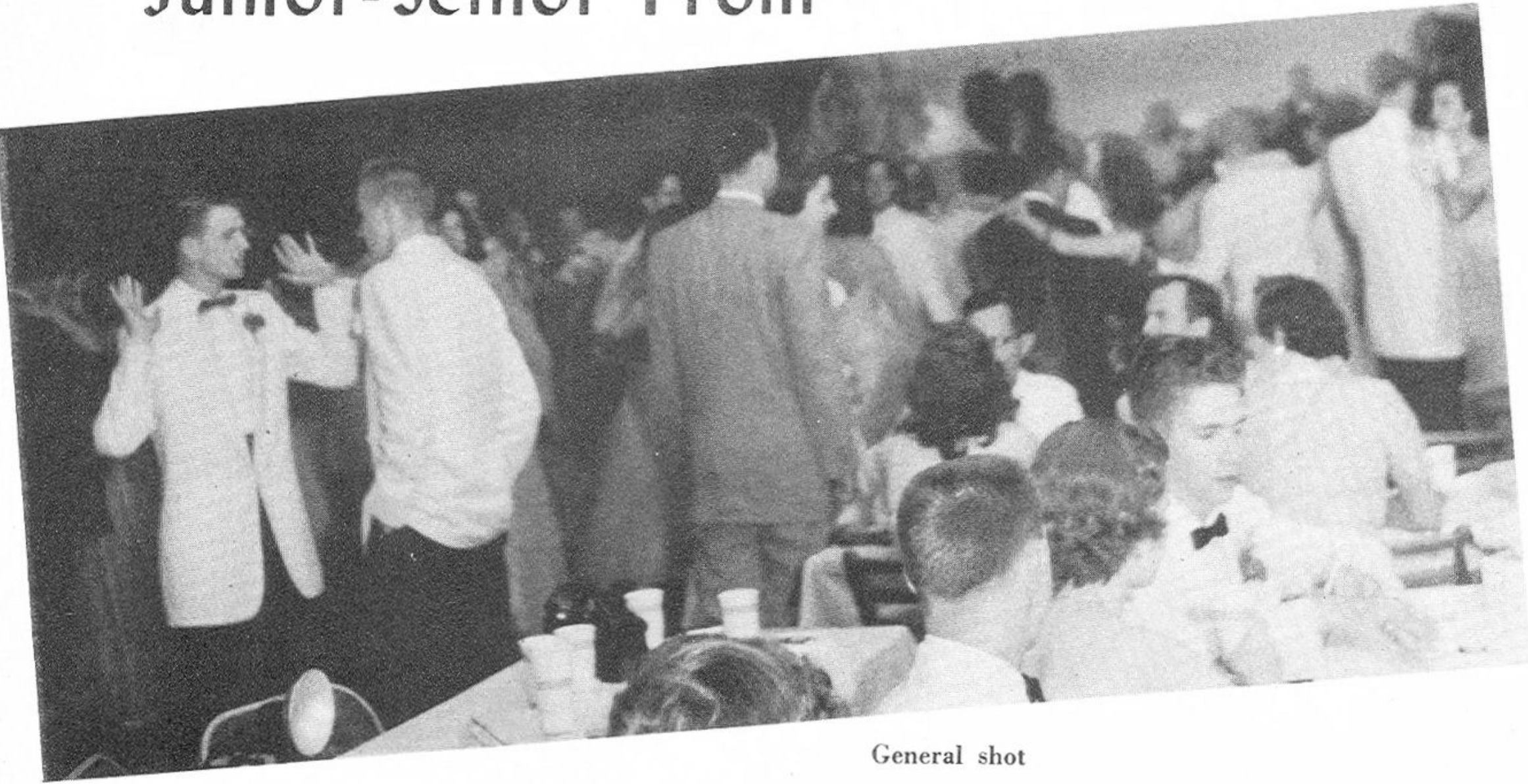

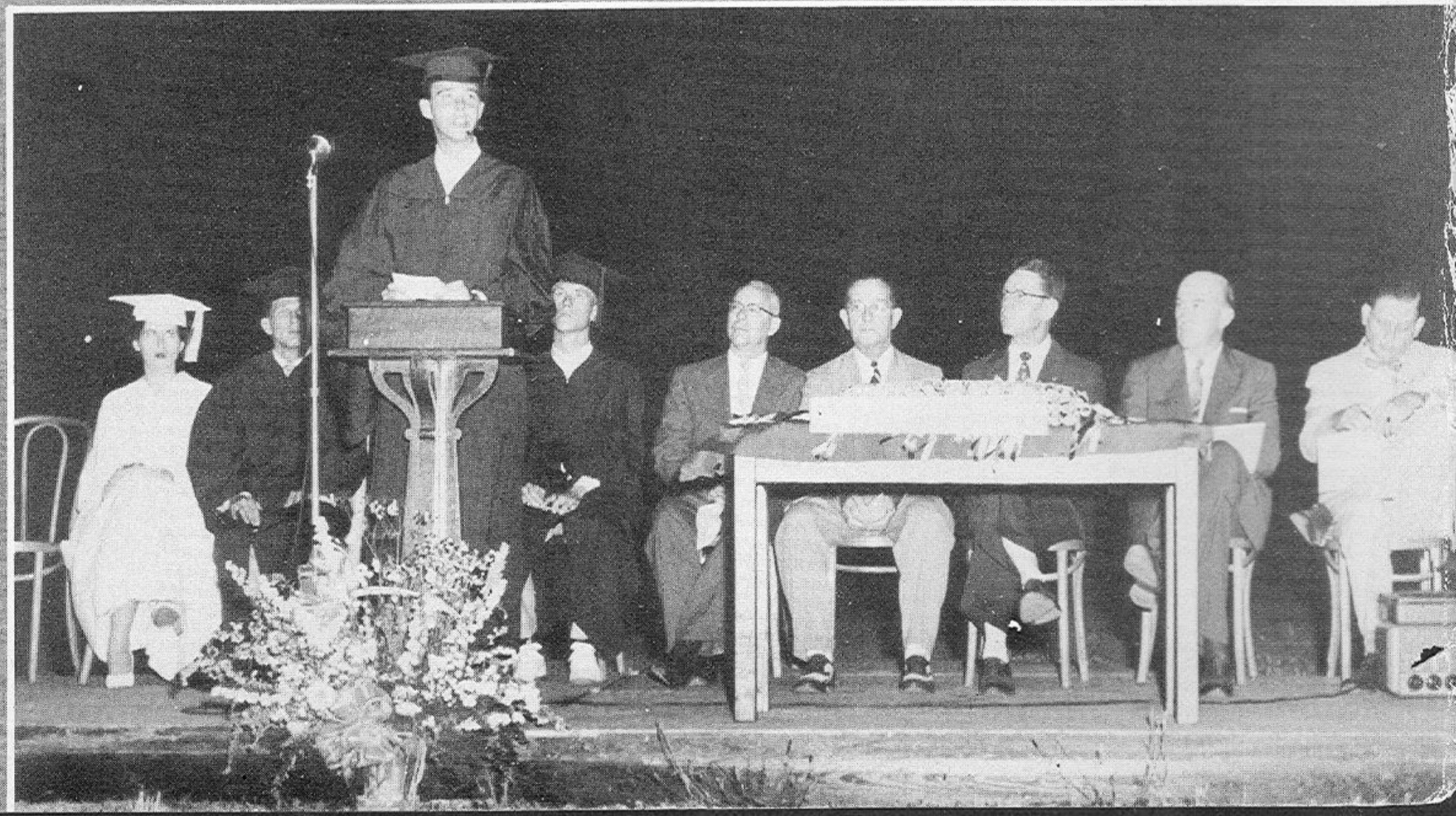
